While the laws governing powers of attorney are not overly complicated, in practice determining whether to accept any given power of attorney can be difficult. Often a power of attorney is not clearly drafted which then raises concerns over whether to permit the attorney-in-fact to access a principal's financial accounts.

What are the rights of financial institutions when it comes to relying on a power of attorney? Can the institution accept a copy of a power of attorney if the original is not available? What if there are concerns over whether the principal is incapacitated, yet the power of attorney is not durable? How is the principal's incapacitation even determined? What if there are multiple attorneys-in-fact or multiple powers of attorney?
